Once members had food, the meeting resumed and continued with the remainder of the show report. There were about 20 members (including board and officers) in attendance. The meeting adjourned at about 7:45.

Oak Ridge Kennel Club's Thirteenth Tracking Dog Test

ORKC's 13th AKC Tracking Test workers arrived at headquarters at a new location at the beautiful Lucky 7 Ranch in

Sweetwater, March 11, 2017. The weather was cold and slightly windy, but a beautiful day. We had three entrants. At 8:00 a.m. the day began with the draw for tracks. The draw items were beautiful St Patrick's Day tracking flags made by Kathy Frank. The judges for this test were Karen Boyce and Jeff Whitsitt.

Track #1 - Fail - Tracklayer Dan Faulkner, Entrant Escort Susan Corum. The first track was drawn by Lorie Jolly and her Golden Retriever, Morningstar Turning Point, UD, MH, OM1, AX, AXJ, VCX, CCA, WCX, also known as Hudson from Sparta, TN. He started the first leg with confidence, went 105 yards and made the



first turn to the left. He continued straight up the hill for another 130 yards, and on the corner, he went left with the wind, but the track went right. Today was not Hudson's day, but this team shows great promise.



Track #2 - PASS - Tracklayer Gurusahai Khalsa-Moyers, Entrant Escort Susan Corum. This track was drawn by Beth White and her miniature Poodle MACH5 Menina de Prata, CD, RE, JH, MXB2, MJC2, MXF, T2B3, CA, THDN, CGCA, HPCX also known as Nina from Maryville, TN. The little Poodle that ran this track was impressive! This team

was eager to go, accurate, and confident. She tracked with joy and precision. Her track began up a hill for 60 yards, she immediately made the right turn for another 65 yards, turned straight uphill again for another 80 yards. The wind was swirling at the top of the hill, but she worked it out on the right turn for another 90 yards. Her fourth turn

went straight back down the hill for 100 yards, and at the bottom another left turn for 50 yards. This was Beth's first TD, and what a wonderful job with a very joyful tracking dog!



Track #3 - Fail - Tracklayer Carol Stone, Entrant Escort Susan Corum. This track was drawn by Cheryl Tisdale and her Golden Retriever, Half Moon Unanswered Prayer, CGC from Milton, TN. The



first leg went straight across the top of a hill for 95 yards, and then made a right turn down the hill for 55 yards. The young Golden was a very fast tracker, working the corners relentlessly. The left turn across the middle of the hill was no obstacle, and neither was the right turn further down the hill for 75 yards. She continued to make another right turn for 120 yards, and it was heartbreaking to be within 55 yards of the glove and turn left instead of right. This is a fabulous tracking dog and will get her title very soon.

One out of three passes ain't bad. Our chief tracklayer, Sharon Fesmire, did a wonderful job as usual. Susi Wilcher was on hand again willing to direct everyone to where the best spot to watch the test was located, and with track maps. We all headed to headquarters for our

celebratory smorgasbord.
All the workers brought
their specialty dishes, and

Rally® NEWS AND UPDATES



March 14, 2017 - AKC Rally Program Enhancements

The Companion Events Department is pleased to announce new enhancements to the AKC Rally® program. The AKC Rally program has not had any changes to the class structure since its launch in 2005. We thank you, the clubs, for your continued support in hosting AKC Rally trials.

Over the years we have heard from many rally handlers who have won the Rally Novice title, saying they are not ready to move up to the Advanced level class, which requires the dog to work off-leash. AKC has created a new class and title for dogs that have won the Rally Novice title, but have not yet earned a qualifying score in the Advanced class. The Rally Intermediate class and associated title (RI), will provide a stepping-stone class to help prepare teams for the off-leash performance required in the Advanced class. The Intermediate course is a mirror image of the Advanced course without a jump. It is the Novice exhibitor's choice to take advantage of this additional opportunity and the RI title is not required to enter the Advanced class. We have also listened to the Rally Fancy who have long asked for a champion level title. We are excited to announce the new Master class and associated title (RM), as well as the Rally Champion title (RACH), both of which will provide additional challenges for dedicated rally exhibitors.

The criteria to earn the RACH title (sounds like "ROCK") requires the team to earn 20 triple qualifying scores; qualifying in the Advanced B, Excellent B and Master classes at the same trial, at 20 separate events, plus earn 300 RACH points from the Excellent B and Master classes. Points are determined by a dog's score. At least 200 RACH points must be earned from the Rally Master class.

Please review the full details of these program enhancements at the links below and share this information with your club members responsible for managing your rally events.

Clubs may start to apply for events with these new classes on August 1, 2017 for events held on or after November 1, 2017.
