Looking forward:

ORKC held a tracking event for TDU (tracking dog urban) and VST (variable surface tracking) on Oct 16, 2022. It is a joy to watch these talented dogs work!!! The full report will be in next Woofers.

November work day(s) at club Nov 19-20. I hope to have hot dogs on the grill for workers! What needs doing:

1. Clean up/figure out what is in metal building (take everything out, ID, sort for keep or trash, clean, donate, etc.) Ditto for the two small buildings.
2. Inventory of club equipment (agility equipment is already complete) (need someone with laptop and Excel skills to record) We need an inventory for insurance purposes (just in case) and for keeping track of what needs fixing/replacing.
3. Clean, wet mop, and reseal mats in West building, probably best done late Saturday or on Sunday. The sealer needs 24 hours to cure.
4. Evaluation of dry-rotted baseboards in East. Water comes under middle door in heavy rain w/ winds from the west, baseboards get wet and so on.

After input from Bonnie Hornfisher, the Board is looking at some changes both to new member application and to renewal applications. Of immediate interest to current members is the possible addition of a volunteer hour requirement in order to have access to club facilities for practice (ie, the gate combination). There are plenty of volunteer opportunities: most need physical presence but some can be done from home. We were unable to have a booth at the Oak Ridge Chamber of Commerce "Cars for Canines" to benefit the local shelters because only one person stepped up. Becky and her Barn Hunt crew could have used more help from club members. Come and help at the club work day! As always, your input is appreciated--to me directly or to any other officer or director.

Susan Varrasso has done the work to get ORKC licensed to hold scent work trials! She is now scouting out venues. Thank you Susan!!!

ORKC is also in need of a Show Chairman for the 2023 All Breed show in Harriman. The dates are reserved with Roane State, and a placeholder application has been submitted to AKC to reserve the dates on AKC's calendar. There is a great detailed (although perhaps a bit out of date) writeup in the club procedure book that I can send anyone interested; AKC has much guidance available on its web site; for example, <https://images.akc.org/pdf/MEAC01.pdf> and <https://images.akc.org/pdf/RESHOW.pdf> (Shella's comment: some of this was a bit obscure to find on AKC web site--call or email me if you can't easily find more.) Prior experience would be lovely but not required. Organizational skills are absolutely necessary. Please call or email me if you are interested and we can talk!

We also need 3 or 4 ORKC members to form a judges selection committee. Our show is small enough that 4, max 5 judges for conformation need to be hired--and the sooner the better as far as getting good judges. Again call or email me for more info.

A peek at our past: please read the short article from Robert Pless. He was instrumental in ORKC's acquisition of our property which was part of the old National Guard Armory in Oak Ridge. Once the property was in our hands, many club members, both current and past, worked very hard to get the club's facility to its current state. This is a story that new members, especially, need to hear and learn from! We are so very blessed to have our buildings and grounds, but we also have to remember that it is a great responsibility for the club and its members.



Oak Ridge Kennel Club held only the 2nd VST test in Tennessee on Sunday, 10/16/2022 along with a TDU test. We had great weather and judges, wonderful volunteers from the club and lovely property to track on. The Event Chair was Jean Burdick who as always did a fabulous job organizing the volunteers. We had 3 entrants in the VST (Variable Surface Tracking) test and 4 entrants in the TDU (Tracking Dog Urban) test. The VST tracks were held at Pellissippi State Community College, Knoxville and the TDU tracks were held at Roane State Community College, Harriman.

We were thrilled to have 2 VST passes and 2 TDU passes! Our judges were Ed Presnall and Deb Maheu from Michigan who designed some lovely and fun tracks. The weather was also just about perfect.



Save the Dates!

November 19 and 20, 2022, Saturday/Sunday Work day at the club!! The metal building needs to be emptied and contents identified for keep/donate/trash. History of Oak Ridge Kennel Club by Robert Pless

My wife, Teresa and I joined ORKC sometime around January 2004 after we got our first Sheltie, Casey. At the time, classes were held in the old armory building in front of the training facility. It was by far not the ideal training facility as before and after each training night, the heavy rubber mats had to be rolled out and then rolled back up after class and stored in large wooden boxes. Sometime in 2006, the club was notified that the armory would be closing and Mary Decuir who was President at the time formed a search committee to try and find a new training facility. I was not a part of the search committee but Marvin and Marg Ellis were and reached out to me for help. Little did I know at the time that this endeavor would turn into another full-time job.

Throughout the next year, we looked at numerous buildings that were either not suitable or too expensive to rent. We contacted the city manager at the time, Jim O'Conner to see if the city could help us out in any way.

After all, ORKC was one of the oldest organizations in the city as we were established just two years after the city. We were shown several pieces of property that the city agreed to lease to us but the lease payments, cost of clearing the property and constructing a building were out of reach for the club.

I finally contacted the Tennessee National Guard in Nashville and was able to speak with the Commander about the Oak Ridge property. He was very helpful and told me that once they were through with the property, it would be turned over to the Real Property Division and provided me with a phone number to contact them. I called and was informed of the process where the property would first be offered to another state agency, then to the county and then to the city. The commander was also able to secure the Clinton armory building for us to use for training during 2007.

I contacted the county mayor and was informed that they had no interest in the property. We knew that Girls Inc. was interested in obtaining this property and it was around this time that I was introduced to Stacey Meyers who was the President of Girls Inc.



After talking with Mr. Meyers, we decided to join forces and ask the city to obtain the property and then sell it to our organizations. Mr. Meyers and I spent many hours discussing the division of the property as well as meeting with the city manager, mayor, city attorney and city council members. We attended city council meetings where city manager Jim O'Conner made a proposal for the city to purchase the armory property. The property was appraised by the state for \$750,000.00 but the buildings were not included in the appraisal as they were deemed to have out lived their use. The city was able to acquire the property for 5% of the appraisal or \$40,000.00. Mr. O'Conner then made a proposal to city council that the city sell the property to both ORKC and Girls Inc. In early March of 2008, I attended a meeting with the city manager, mayor and city attorney and provided them with a check for \$18,462.00 for the property that is ORKC today.

The property was not in the condition it is today as the training buildings were the garages where service was performed on the armory equipment. By now, both my wife and I were on the board and I was given the title of building director and work began to transform this facility into the best facility we could. I had a vision of what this property could be and I spent countless hours trying to make that vision come true with help from club members.

Through the years, the board members of ORKC did an outstanding job of making investments and saving money and we were able to pay for the property and the renovations without having to borrow any money. The club has a clear deed to the property and is one of very few kennel clubs that own property to hold training classes in the Southeast. Although Teresa and I are no longer members, this facility holds a place in both our hearts. I still to this day tell friends and acquaintances that ORKC is the very best training facility in the Southeast. I am proud to be a part of the history of ORKC.
